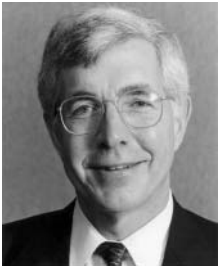


Treasurer's Report

It has been a great privilege, honor and responsibility to complete my two year term as Treasurer for the AACAP. I take my fiduciary responsibility very seriously and continue to work closely with Virginia Anthony, Executive Director, Min Zhao, Comptroller and other AACAP staff to ensure that the

AACAP's finances are clear, understandable and fully accountable to the Council, the Executive Committee and AACAP members.

I know that many members do not have the interest, nor take the time to carefully review the Treasurer's financial reports. Let me assure you, however, that the Treasurer and officers stay close to the details. In fact, the AACAP's finances annually involve thousands of individual transactions—each of which must be carefully tracked. This level of complexity and detail requires significant skill and oversight by the Comptroller, the finance department staff, the Executive Director and Treasurer.

The "bottom line" – in 2005 the AACAP continues to be in sound fiscal and financial shape. Our investments continue to provide modest growth. In addition, both our endowment and operating reserve fund continue to grow.

The following represent some of my activities as Treasurer during 2005:

- Continued to review all checks/balances and internal control mechanisms related to AACAP funds, finance and accounting.
- Continued the systematic annual budgeting process to ensure that new and continuing initiatives reflect the priorities of the AACAP and advance its mission.
- Supported the Phase II of "Campaign for America's Kids" – the Access Initiative.
- Worked closely with the Financial Planning Committee (**John Dunne, M.D.**, Chair) to oversee the AACAP's investments and major financial initiatives.
- Developed a comprehensive database that includes detailed information on every special fund in the AACAP's restricted assets.
- Participated as ex officio member of the Grants and Oversight Committee (**Richard Cohen, M.D.**, Chair), a committee that works to oversee the complex federal grants received by the AACAP.
- Provided ongoing monitoring of the limited funding provided to the AACAP by pharmaceutical companies.
- Worked toward continuous quality improvement in the Treasurer's Financial Reports to ensure accuracy, make them more "user-friendly" and to enhance clarity.

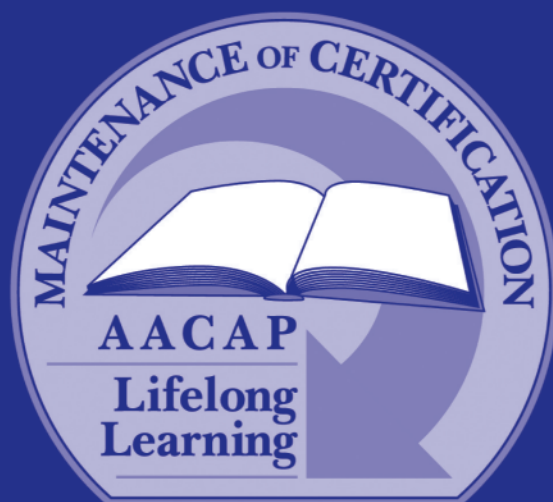
